

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DESCRIPTION

In Algebra 2 you will develop reasoning and problem solving skills as you study topics such as solving linear equations and inequalities, solving absolute value equations and inequalities, graphing linear equations, modeling data and making predictions with linear regressions, graphing linear inequalities, solving systems of equations using various methods, quadratic equations, polynomial functions, exponent rules, radical equations, exponential and logarithmic functions, rational functions, conic sections, probability, sequences and series, and trigonometry.

TECHNOLOGY: A graphing calculator (TI-83 Plus/TI-84) is highly recommended.
